













The Westlock townsite was originally surveyed in 1912 and on March 13, 1916 Westlock was formally incorporated as a Village with a population of 65. With a population of 854, Westlock was granted town status by the Province on January 7, 1947.

Westlock was named after William Westgate and William Lockhart, the gentleman from whom the land was purchased for the original townsite. Westlock's first grain elevator was constructed in 1916, the first bank (Merchant's Bank) opened in 1918 and the first newspaper (Westlock Witness) commenced operation in 1919. The first hospital to serve Westlock and area residents, the Immaculata Hospital, was opened in 1928 by the Sisters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul. It was vacated in 1995, after the new Westlock Healthcare Centre opened and was eventually demolished in 1997.

A historical point of interest is the Edison settlement, an area settled in 1902 approximately six kilometres east and three kilometres south of Westlock. Initially named "Little Grande Prairie" by the first residents. Edison once had a store, post office, hotel, blacksmith, school and church. Most of the homesteaders reached the "Little Grande Prairie" area via the Athabasca Landing Trail, which is approximately thirty two kilometres east of the settlement. It was, at this time, a major route connecting Edmonton with the north. In 1913, the E.D. and B.C. Railway was developed adjacent to the hamlet, making Westlock the main hamlet in the region and leading to the eventual closure or relocation of many of the businesses and services in Edison. Today, the only reminder of this early settlement, which may have become the region's main centre if not for the location of the railway, is a historical sign posted at the weigh scales east of Westlock.

By the end of World War I, Westlock was, and to this day still is, an established service centre.



911 EMERGENCY SERVICE

Fire Department and Emergency Management

- Fire safety in the Town of Westlock is the responsibility of the Fire Chief, supported by 20 volunteer firefighters who make up the Westlock Fire Department. This volunteer fire department is dedicated to ensuring that the community receives effective, efficient, and professional fire protection and rescue services. Many hours are dedicated to planning, training, and preparation in order to ensure that the Westlock Fire Department provides exceptional service.
- Emergency management is the proactive planning and practice to be prepared for any emergency or disaster which may occur within the Town.

Municipal Enforcement

- The Town of Westlock places high value on the safety and security of its residents and visitors. In this effort, the Town employs a Community Peace Officer who deals with a variety of circumstances that arise.
- It is the responsibility of the Community Peace Officer to investigate complaints, and enforce limited provincial statutes and the Town Bylaws, including, but not limited to, the Community

Standards, Traffic and Dog Bylaws. Duties also include moving traffic violations under the Traffic Safety Act, on Highway #18 and #44, within the Town Limits.

Westlock Aquatic Centre

The Westlock Aquatic Centre offers fitness and fun for the entire family! This full-service centre has something for everyone. A full indoor six-lane, 25m pool, with zero depth play area, slides and water spray features as well as a deep-water Tarzan rope and rock wall. Other amenities include a steam room and hot tub for all ages' enjoyment! There are aqua fitness classes, lane swim, public swim and swimming lesson opportunities as well as a 24-hour gym.

There is a complete fitness centre with a variety of cardio and free-standing and stationary weight training equipment complimented by a racquetball and squash court with equipment available for rental. A multi-purpose meeting room used for birthday party rentals and all varieties of courses and meetings.

New to the facility is a virtual rec room featuring High Definition Golf simulator and multi-sport capabilities great for practice during long winter months. Also compatible with game consoles for patrons who wish to have a theatre-style gaming experience.




Westlock Rotary Spirit Centre

This state-of-the-art facility encompasses a variety of recreational and fitness opportunities for all users; there is something for everyone! A standard NHL size arena hosts the Sr. Men's AA Warriors Hockey Team, Westlock Minor Hockey, Westlock Figure Skating, Westlock Fun Hockey, Pembina Ringette and various adult commercial users and a summer hockey camp. In the spring Westlock Lacrosse plays host to its Minor and Junior Rock Teams. On the second floor a walking/running track is available daily for another fitness option!

The field house is a multi-use sport and culture venue that plays host to various volleyball, basketball and badminton tournaments, fitness classes, as well as drop-in leisure times for various sports including pickleball, tennis and floor hockey. The field house has also hosted various concerts from Nitty Gritty Dirt Band and Dwight Yoakam over the past number of years.

There is also a fitness centre with modern Life Fitness cardio and resistance training equipment. A fitness room is home to a variety of fitness classes including pound, yoga and spin biking. A children's play area is also available





on the main level with an indoor playground for drop-in opportunities and birthday party rentals.

Westlock Curling Centre


The Pioneer Museum is open from May to September. Guided Tours are available during the off-season.


