



Planning Any Home Improvements?

Development Services is ready to help guide you through your home improvement projects.

Projects that do not need a permit:



Fences

Fences do not require a permit if they are 6.0ft or less in your rear yard and 3.0ft or less in your front yard.



Landscaping

A permit is not required for landscaping that does not change the grade and drainage of your property.



Sheds (102.3 sq ft or less)

Small sheds do not require a permit if they are 1.0m (3.3ft) from your side and rear property lines.



Cosmetic Renovations

Painting, flooring, siding, windows and doors (same size of opening), roofing, etc. do not require permits.

Projects that need a permit:



Garages & Sheds (Over 102.3 sq ft)

Development and building permits are required.



Uncovered Decks

Decks 2.0ft or higher from grade require development and building permits.



Hot Tubs and Swimming Pools

Above ground hot tubs and swimming pools require a building and an electrical permit.



Covered Decks and Additions

Development and building permits are required.

PRESCHOOL LEVELS 1 - 5 (eight week program)

COST: \$48.65

The Preschool Program gives children a head start on learning to swim. Preschool Programs develop fundamental physical literacy skills for aquatic activities.

In our preschool program we work to ensure 3 - 5 year olds become comfortable in the water and have fun developing a foundation of water skills. We incorporate Lifesaving Society Water Smart® education in all Preschool levels.

Swim for Life - Preschool Level 1

These preschoolers learn to enter and exit shallow water safely and to put their face in the water blowing bubbles. They will learn to move safely in shallow water and to wear a lifejacket to be comfortable with floats and back glides.

Swim for Life - Preschool Level 2

These youngsters will jump into chest deep water and learn to submerge and to exhale underwater. They will be introduced to lateral rollovers and will practice front and back glides as well as flutter kick wearing a lifejacket or other buoyant aid.

Swim for Life - Preschool 3

These youngsters will perform a sideways entry into deep water wearing a lifejacket. They will recover objects from the bottom in waist deep water. They will master independent front and back floats, lateral rollovers, front and back glides, and flutter kick on front and back.

Swim for Life - Preschool Level 4

These independent preschoolers will master short swims of front crawl (5 m) and will be introduced to side glides and flutter kick performed on their side. New challenges such as opening the eyes underwater, pendulum rollovers onto the back, and treading of water using the sculling action of hand are presented at this level.

Swim for Life – Preschool 5

These skilled preschoolers will demonstrate that they can support themselves in deep water for 10 seconds using the sculling action and a supportive kick. Wearing a lifejacket, they will practice a forward roll entry into deep water. Whip kick, back crawl, and interval training will also be introduced. Preschool 5 graduates will be prepared to enter Swimmer 2 at 6 years of age.

SWIMMER LEVELS: SWIMMER 1 - 4 (eight week program)

SWIMMER 5 - 6 (eight week program)

The Swimmer Program makes sure children learn the fundamental physical literacy skills for aquatic activities. Progressions accommodate 5 - 12 year olds, including beginners and swimmers who want to build on the basics.

Lots of in-water practice develops solid swimming strokes and skills. Water Smart® education is part of every level.

Swimmer 1

This level is the foundation for swimming skill development. These beginners will become comfortable jumping into water with and without a lifejacket. They'll learn to open their eyes, exhale, and hold their breath underwater. They'll work on floats, glides and kicking through the water on their front and back.

Swimmer 2

These advanced beginners will jump into deeper water and learn to be comfortable falling sideways into the water wearing a lifejacket. They'll be able to support themselves at the surface without an aid, learn whip kick, swim 10 m on their front and back, and be introduced to flutter kick interval training $(4 \times 5 \text{ m})$.

Swimmer 3

These junior swimmers will dive and do in-water front somersaults and handstands. They'll work on 15 m of front crawl, back crawl and 10 m of whip kick. Flutter kick interval training increases to 4 x 15 m.

Swimmer 4

These intermediate swimmers will swim 5 m underwater and lengths of front, back crawl, whip kick, and breaststroke arms with breathing. Their new bag of tricks includes the completion of the Canadian Swim to Survive® Standard. They'll cap it all off with front crawl sprints over 25 m and 4 x 25 m front or back crawl interval training.

Swimmer 5

These swimmers will master shallow dives, cannonball entries, eggbeater kicks, and in-water backward somersaults. They'll refine their front and back crawl over 50 m swims of each, and breaststroke over 25 m. Then they'll pick up the pace in 25 m sprints and two interval training bouts: 4×50 m front or back crawl and 4×15 m breaststroke.

Swimmer 6

These advanced swimmers will rise to the challenge of sophisticated aquatic skills including stride entries, compact jumps and lifesaving kicks like eggbeater and scissor kick. They'll develop strength and power in head-up breaststroke sprints over 25 m. They'll easily swim lengths of front crawl, back crawl, and breaststroke, working their way up to the 300m workout.





BRONZE MEDALLION: Challenges the candidate both mentally and physically. Judgement, knowledge, skill, and fitness – the four components of water rescue-form the basis of Bronze Medallion training. Candidates acquire the assessment and problem-solving skills needed to make good decisions in, on, and around the water. Bronze Medallion is a prerequisite for assistant lifeguard training in Bronze Cross. *Minimum of four participants to run course.

PREREQUISITES: Minimum 13 years of age or Bronze Star certification (*Need not to be current*).

BRONZE CROSS: Begins the transition from lifesaving to lifeguarding and prepares candidates for responsibilities as assistant lifeguards. 



GENERAL FACILITY RULES & REGULATIONS Westlock Aquatic Centre and Westlock Rotary Spirit Centre

Footwear – Only indoor, non-marking shoes will be permitted. No hiking boots, dress shoes, flip flops, open toes or socks will be permitted.

Food & Drink – No food or drink is permitted in the field house, weight rooms, court areas, pool or pool deck or walking track. Water is the only exception, but it must be in a sealed bottle with a lid.

Age Restrictions

Pool – Those 7 years old & younger must be accompanied by a person 15 years old or older at all times. 15 years and older can watch up to 3 children under 8 years old.

Weight Rooms – Must be 14 years old or older for full use of weight room areas. Those 12 & 13 years old may use the cardio equipment only but must be supervised by an adult at all times.

24-Hour Gym - 14 to 17 olds can come with adults but both need valid passes

Field House - Those 8 years old & younger must be accompanied by a person 14 years old or older at all times.

Arena - Those 8 years old & younger must be accompanied by a person 14 years old or older at all times.

Squash/Racquetball Court – Must be 12 years old or older.

Medical Holds – Passes can be put on hold for medical reasons for a maximum of 1 month; a written statement/ form from your physician is required.

Equipment Rental

The use of our sporting equipment is FREE with a paid Full Facility Pass or day admission during drop-in leisure times. We do however require that you leave an item as a deposit for the equipment taken (i.e., driver's license, car keys, etc.). Please treat our equipment with respect to help ensure this service will remain in place for all users to come. If you require a lock, they can be rented for \$0.75 and requires a deposit. This service is complimentary for Pass Holders.
