In our preschool program we work to ensure 3 - 5 year olds become comfortable in the water and have fun developing a foundation of water skills. We incorporate Lifesaving Society Water Smart® education in all Preschool levels.

Swim for Life - Preschool Level 4

These independent preschoolers will master short swims of front crawl (5 m) and will be introduced to side glides and flutter kick performed on their side. New challenges such as opening the eyes underwater, pendulum rollovers onto the back and treading of water using the sculling action of hand are presented at this level.

Swim for Life - Preschool 5

COST: \$47.25

These skilled preschoolers will demonstrate that they can support themselves in deep water for 10 seconds using the sculling action and a supportive kick. Wearing a lifejacket, they will practice a forward roll entry into deep water. Whip kick, back crawl and interval training will also be introduced. Preschool 5 graduates will be prepared to enter Swimmer 2 at 6 years of age.

They'll learn to open their eyes, exhale and hold their breath underwater. They'll work on floats, glides and kicking through the water on their front and back.

These advanced beginners will jump into deeper water and learn to be comfortable falling sideways into the water wearing a lifejacket. They'll be able to support themselves at the surface without an aid, learn whip kick, swim 10 m on their front and back, and be introduced to flutter kick interval training (4 x 5 m).

Fences, Sheds, Decks, Signs, and Additions: Your Guide to Permit Regulations LUB 2015-02

General Provisions

- No structure may be built or placed over a gas line or within a utility easement or right-of-way.
- The Town sidewalk, lane, pavement, or fence line is not the property line.
 The most accurate way to determine where your property lines are is from a survey of the property.
- A development permit is valid for one


 (1) year only; if development is not
 commenced within one year, a new
 permit is required.
- A building permit is valid for 90 days only; if construction is not commenced within 90 days, a new permit is required.
- Any Electrical, Gas, and Plumbing to be commenced must be accompanied by a permit.
- No excavation, storage, or piling up of materials shall be kept in any part of the yard unless all safety measures are undertaken, and the owner of such materials or excavation assumes full responsibility and does not permit the excavation or storage to last any longer than reasonably necessary to complete the particular stage of construction work.

Fence Regulations

- The maximum height for a fence that does not extend beyond the portion of the house closest to the front property line (back yard) is 1.8m (6.0ft).
- The maximum height for a fence for the portion between the house and the front lot line (front yard) is 0.9m (3.0ft).
- A fence may be constructed on or within your property lines.
- Fences must not encroach onto public property.
- Permits are not required for a fence unless you wish to build it higher than the allowable limits. In that case, you would then need a development permit for a height variance.

Shed Regulations

- No permits are required for a Shed if it is under 9.5m² (102.3ft²) in floor area.
- If the shed is over 9.5m² (102.3ft²) in floor area a Development Permit and Building Permit are required.
- If a shed is pre-fabricated or on skids and is over 9.5m² (102.3ft²) in floor area, permits must be applied for.
- Sheds cannot be placed in the front yard.
- The shed must be setback a minimum of 1.0m (3.3ft) from both the side and rear property lines, and must be setback a minimum of 1.9m (6.2ft) from the principal building (or deck).



Deck Regulations

- A Development Permit and Building Permit are required for the construction of a deck higher than 0.6m (2.0ft). A deck below this height is classified as a patio and does not require permits.
- The deck must comply with the accessory building setback requirements. Please see the specific regulations for the appropriate district.

Addition Regulations

- A Development Permit and Building Permit are required for all additions and/or expansions.
- Once an addition is constructed, it is considered part of the principal building and therefore must comply with principal building setback requirements and the allowable lot coverage.
 Please see the specific regulations for the appropriate district.

Sign Permits

How to Apply

- Complete and submit the Sign Development Permit Application with the appropriate fee. Be sure to include:
 - ✓ A site plan, with dimensions indicated, showing the front, rear and side yard setbacks.
 - ✓ A statement of ownership of land including the signature or written consent of the registered owner and applicant.
 - ✓ The date of placement.
 - ✓ All other supporting information required. (see application)
- 2. If the sign is a discretionary use, the application will have to go before the Municipal Planning Commission for decision. If the sign is a permitted use, the application will be either approved or refused by the Development Authority, within the Planning and Development Department.
- 3. Once approved and processed there is a standard two (2) week appeal process prior to the issuance of the Development Permit. However, if it is a Permitted Use, only the applicant can appeal the conditions.
- 4. The applicant will receive a Notice of Decision once processed, stating the conditions of the permit and the effective issuance date.
- After the issuance of the Development Permit, Building, Electrical, Gas, and Plumbing Permits must be applied for.

Spring & Summer Fire Safety Tips

In the House

- ✓ Test your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, change batteries immediately if needed. For more information check out our section on smoke alarm maintenance and carbon monoxide detector maintenance.
- Check for overloaded or damaged extension cords, replace where needed.
- ✓ Ensure you have an emergency preparedness kit in case of incidents such as power outages and flooding.
- Practice your families fire escape plan so everyone knows what to do in case of an emergency.
- ✓ Windows should be checked to ensure they open and close properly, in case they are needed as an exit.
- Properly store household chemicals and never mix cleaning agents.
- Recycle: Get rid of old newspapers, magazines and junk mail. These items tend to pile up and can greatly contribute to the severity and spread of fire.
- ✓ Check and clean filters above stove.
- ✓ Pull refrigerator out and vacuum or dust the coils.
- Always keep stairs and landings clear for safe evacuation in event of an emergency.

Around the house

- Make sure your address numbers are up and visible from the street.
- ✓ Maintain a clear 'fire zone' of 10' around structures.
- ✓ Check outdoor electrical outlets and other electrical appliances for animal nests and to ensure proper wiring.
- ✓ Keep 100' of garden hose with an attached nozzle connected and ready for use.
- Remove leaves and trash from carports and garages.
 Combustible materials are dangerous if they are exposed to heated automobile components, especially under the vehicle.
- ✓ Clean up and properly store paints, pool and yard chemicals.
- Check fuels containers for leaks and make sure they are properly stored.
- ✓ Let power equipment sit for approximately 30 minutes before placing it inside to be sure there is no possibility of fire.



Spring & Summer Fire Safety Tips

Seasonal Property Fire Safety

(this includes but is not limited to cottages, cabins, motorhomes/recreational vehicles, boats, and houseboats etc.)

- ✓ Test smoke alarms at least monthly or each time you return to your seasonal home. Pack a new smoke alarm and extra smoke alarm batteries in case they need replacement.
- ✓ Install and ensure carbon monoxide alarms in your seasonal home if it has a fuel-burning appliance.
- ✓ Develop and practice a home fire escape plan to ensure everyone knows what to do if the smoke alarm sounds.
- ✓ Know the telephone number for the local fire department and your seasonal home's emergency sign number, in case of emergency.
- ✓ Clean barbecues before using them. Keep an eye on lit barbecues and ensure all combustibles, as well as children and pets are kept well away from them. Fires can happen when barbecues are left unattended.
- ✓ Keep barbecue lighters and matches out of sight and reach of children.
- Remember to bring a flashlight with extra batteries.
- ✓ Check heating appliances and chimneys before using them.
- Check with your local fire department or municipality to determine whether open air burning is permitted before having a campfire or burning brush. If open burning is allowed, fires should be built on bare soil or on exposed rock. Remove leaves and twigs from around the fire to keep it from spreading. Always keep a bucket of water, sand, or even a shovel close by and supervise the fire at all times.

BBQ Tips

- ✓ All barbeque grills must only be used outdoors using grills indoors or in enclosed spaces is not only a fire hazard, but it exposes occupants to toxic gasses and potential asphyxiation.
- ✓ Always position the grill well away from combustible objects, as buildings, fences, deck railings and landscaping can easily and quickly ignite.
- ✓ Get your grill cleaned and serviced. Check all propane tanks and lines for leaks and damage.
- ✓ Never leave a lit grill unattended.
- ✓ Always use long handled grilling utensils and heat resistant oven mitts to avoid exposure burns from heat and flames.
- ✓ Periodically remove grease build-up in catch trays to prevent it from igniting.
- ✓ Keep a garden hose nearby, connected and ready for use in case of a fire.
- ✓ Bring a fire extinguisher or fire blanket to your outdoor trip. This way, you can easily extinguish fire before it grows out of hand. Fire accidents can happen anytime and it always pays to be prepared.
- ✓ Before you use a grill, first check the connection between the propane tank and fuel line to see if this is not blocked. See to it that you do not overfill the propane tank.
- ✓ Douse hot coals with plenty of water before disposing of them. Never put them inside plastic, paper or wooden trash bins or containers.
- ✓ Use barbecue grills away from the house, from the tent, or from anything that can easily catch fire.
- ✓ If outside and your clothes catch fire, use the STOP, DROP and ROLL method. Use a fire extinguisher to put out a small fire that is not yet spreading. Call the fire department immediately.






