



Welcome to the Town of Westlock

Westlock is an agricultural community with a strong commercial base and a variety of amenities. Aside from being the agricultural hub, the local economy has business services, retail, government administration and manufacturing. We serve a trading area of approximately 22,000 population.

Westlock is proud that the world's first articulated liquified natural gas refueler was manufactured here in the town by one of our manufacturers. We have excellent transportation connections and a high-evolved technological infrastructure. Our urban amenities and small town lifestyle has attracted a well-educated and skilled workforce.

Economic Indicators

Agriculture

The area around Westlock is primarily agricultural, hence the Town has a number of agricultural related services and employers. Westlock was primarily a centre for grain trade and storage. Westlock Terminals maintains this presence; it is the province's first new generation co-operative (NGC) grain company. Westlock Terminals is a jointly owned commercial operation with over 270 shareholders. It has developed new ways of adding value to customers and shareholders through innovative services such as commercial trucking and adding a canola cleaning line.

Value-added production services include Hi-Pro Feeds Nutreco Canada Inc. and the Westlock Seed Cleaning Coop Ltd. The Westlock Seed Cleaning Coop is one of the most modern, up-to-date plants in Alberta. They source the most different varieties of seed and have one of the highest volumes of treated seed and pedigreed seed compared to other plants in the province.







Westlock is home to three chick hatcheries: Sunrise Hatchery Inc, Miller Hatcheries Ltd., and Rochester Hatchery.

The Rochester Hatchery is a family owned and run facility. This federally "AAA" rating registered hatchery is the only hatchery in Canada that produces exotic chickens.

Miller Hatcheries Ltd. has been in business for over 100 years!



Two farm implement dealerships are located in Westlock: Martin Deerline and Rocky Mountain Equipment.

A number of agriculture retailers and service providers such as United Farmers of Alberta Co-operatives Ltd (UFA),
Peavey Mart, Cropmaxx Inc., Nutrien Ag Solutions, and Westlock Veterinary Centre are located in Westlock.

Agriculture & Agri-Food Canada has an office in Westlock. Agriculture Financial Services (AFSC), a provincial crown corporation that provides Alberta's agricultural producers, agribusinesses and other small businesses with loans, crop insurance and farm income disaster assistance, has a branch in Westlock.

The JVJ Westlock Auction Mart holds weekly livestock auctions every Thursday morning.



Manufacturing

Westlock has a vibrant manufacturing sector. Copper headers for plumbing, precision water systems, silage and grain storage, culverts, truck accessories for Ford, GM and Chrysler, trailers, and tanker trucks are just some of the items manufactured in Westlock.

Wabash Mfg. Inc. was founded in 1981. It is a well-known manufacturer of quality fluid hauling tanks, trailers and mining support equipment. Wabash Manufacturing, in partnership with Caterpillar OEM Solutions, developed the **world's first articulating LNG refueler**. LNG is becoming an attractive alternative fuel source for the mining industry where fuel is one of their largest costs.



Health Care

The Westlock Health Care Centre draws people from all over the province. This is due in large part to a very successful orthopaedic surgery program. This program was launched in 2004 as a means to decentralize services in Alberta to reduce the backlog within its major urban centres. Westlock has two orthopaedic surgeons and one anaesthesiologist.

The Town also has 12 general practitioners. The Town of Westlock, along with Westlock County and the Village of Clyde, have a successful physician recruitment program.

Westlock has two medical clinics, four pharmacies, three dental clinics, an optometrist, a chiropractor clinic, massage therapists and more. Along with a good supply of seniors housing alternatives, Westlock is an attractive community for retirees.




85% of the population age 15 and higher has completed a high school education.



Facility	Details
Westlock Rotary Spirit Centre	State of the art facility includes a standard NHL size arena, walking/running track, fieldhouse, fitness centre, meeting rooms, and tennis courts. The Field House is a multiuse sport and culture venue for volleyball, basketball and badminton tournaments, fitness classes, and drop in leisure activities such as pickle ball, tennis and floor hockey. The fitness centre has modern Life Fitness cardio and resistance training equipment along with a variety of fitness classes including pilates, yoga, and spin biking. A children's play area and indoor playground is available for drop in opportunities and birthday party rentals.
Westlock Aquatic Centre	Full-service centre includes a full indoor six lane, 25m pool with zero depth play area, slides and water spray features, a deep water Tarzan rope, hot tub, steam room, and a rock wall. A complete fitness centre provides a variety of cardio, free standing and stationary weight training equipment, a racquet ball and squash court plus a multipurpose room for birthday party rentals and other uses. The facility also includes a virtual rec room with a high definition golf simulator and multi-sports capabilities.
Westlock Curling Centre	Located adjacent to the Westlock Rotary Spirit Centre. Includes: 4 sheet ice surface, and upstairs lounge. Can host banquets. Facility is converted in the off season into an indoor training facility for Westlock Minor Ball, and the local hockey camp's shooting school.
Westlock Action Sports Park	Constructed in 2004, the skateboard park offers both skateboard and biking options.
Westlock Rotary Trail	9.1 km designated trail and sidewalk network throughout town.
Altador Park & Keller Field Ball Diamonds	Ball facilities include 4 modern shale diamonds, a senior baseball diamond with grass infield and state of the art dug outs, and a shale school diamond. Various grass diamonds are also available at the local schools.
Tennis Courts	Two full sized Tennis Courts on an asphalt surface, adjacent to the Westlock Rotary Spirit Centre.
Soccer/Football Fields	The Town and Pembina Hills School Division offer two soccer fields at the Westlock Elementary School. One full size field is available for soccer or football.
Outdoor Rink	Located beside the Westlock Elementary School; includes a heated change facility.
Canadian Tractor Museum	 Over 100 fully-restored tractors of all makes on display in the main gallery The Museum has kids' activities, including pedal tractors and a rope maker. A 50 foot tall working weather vane with a 1942 Model D Case on top. The weathervane is the largest in the world and is a great picture opportunity. The museum also has steam engines, stationary engines and horse drawn equipment. The Museum is open to the public from May to September. Off-season guided tours are available.
Westlock Pioneer Museum	 There are four special collections in addition to the museum's general collection: Max and Mary Wiese Aladdin Lamp Collection Bernard Wiese's collection of Sound Machines, Phonographs and Gramophones The Trueblood Gun Collection Mildred Hay Doll Collection The Museum is open from May to September. Guided tours during the off season are available.

Tawatinaw Valley Ski Area	24 downhill runs, a tubing hill, and a terrain park with "hits", "rails", and "funboxes". Over 20 km of scenic cross country ski trails. Lessons/ski school, and rentals.
Westlock Golf Club	This 18-hole championship golf course offers the challenge of a traditional style front nine with tighter fairways and smaller greens. The back nine has large undulating greens and wider fairways. Practice facilities include a two-tiered driving range, chipping and sand practice complex, and putting green.
Edmonton Sky Diving School	Located at Westlock Airport.
Mountie Park Campground	Located at 100 Street and 96 Avenue, this self-registration campsite has 21 sites, most with power, water and sewer. There is access to washrooms, showers, ball diamonds, horseshoe pits, a playground and a half-mile horse race track and rodeo facilities. First come first serve basis. No reservations. Open May long weekend to October.
